<u>RECOMMENDATION</u>: Staff recommends that the Layout, Preliminary and Final Plat be continued to the June 7, 2001 Planning Commission meeting.

<u>GENERAL COMMENTS</u>: The applicant has submitted a Layout Plat for the commercial development of the Trailwood Village Planned Unit Development and a Preliminary and Final Plat for one commercial lot. The property is located north of the intersection of SD Highway 44 and Covington Street. The commercial lot will be the future location for the Rapid Valley Water and Sewer District office.

Staff has met with the applicant's engineer to discuss several issues relative to storm drainage requirements and access locations. The applicant's engineer has submitted revised layout plat and drainage information. However, both the Engineering Division and Pennington County Highway Department have indicated that the information is not adequate at this time. The applicant will need to submit additional drainage information related to the project. The applicant will also need to provide a site distance evaluation to insure the propose street intersections meet all minimum standards. Other information required that has not been submitted includes: utility plans identifying the location of the water main in Covington Street; grading plans for the lots, and erosion control plans.
