The only expense to the City would be advertising costs not to exceed \$800 and portable toilets at an approximate cost of \$125. A flat 10% buyer's premium would be charged on all sales to compensate Jurisch & Associates for their services. (Gena, please ask Jurisch to attend the committee meeting on 2/1 in cash the members have questions.)

If this method is not selected, the cost would be 12.5% on small items and nontitled personal property items and 5.5% commission on vehicles.

Bradeen Real Estate & Auctions, Inc.

6.4% on vehicles and large equipment

12.4% on small items

Martin Jurisch & Assoc.

5,5% on vehicles and large equipment

12.5% on small items

Tri-State Auction Service

10% on all items

Waltman Auctions

10% on sales up to \$30,000 8% on sales \$30,001 and above

Alternate proposal by Martin Jurisch & Assoc

Flat 10% Buyer's Premium, paid by the buyer No additional fees or commissions to the Seller

The City's auction averages \$31,227 with \$21,623 coming from vehicles. Based on these figures, the commissions would have been as follows:

Bradeen Auctions, Inc.:

\$2,574.76

Martin Jurisch & Assoc.:

\$2,389.77 or Alternate Proposal

Tri-State Auction Services:

\$3,122.71

Waltman Auctions:

\$3,098.17

I recommend that the City accept the alternate proposal from Martin Jurisch & Assoc. for the 2006-2008 surplus auctions. If this is not acceptable then I recommend the percentage proposal from Martin Jurisch & Assoc. for the surplus auctions.
