RECOMMENDATION:

Staff recommends that the Vacation of Right-of-Way be denied.

<u>GENERAL COMMENTS</u>: This staff report has been revised as of June 27, 2006. All revised and/or added text is shown in bold print. The applicant is proposing to vacate a portion of South Street Right-of-Way. The right-of-way proposed to be vacated is located west of West Street. The applicant has indicated that they are proposing to landscape the vacated right-of-way.

<u>STAFF REVIEW</u>: Staff has reviewed the proposed Vacation of Right-of-Way request and noted the following issues:

<u>Utilities:</u> Staff has received responses from all affected public utility companies. Midcontinent and Montana-Dakota Utilities had no objections to the Vacation of Right-of-Way. PrairieWave Communications stated that they have facilities located in the right-of-way proposed to be vacated. PraireWave Communications would require an easement to access their facilities. Qwest also stated they had facilities located in the right-of-way and would need an easement to access their facilities. Black Hills Power stated they wished to

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- retain right-of-way as existing overhead and underground power lines are located in the right-of-way proposed to be vacated.
- <u>Water System:</u> Staff noted that there are existing water lines in the right-of-way proposed to be vacated. Staff also noted that these water lines are intended to be maintained and updated in the future.
- <u>Wastewater System:</u> Staff noted that there are existing sewer lines in the right-of-way proposed to be vacated. Staff also noted that these sewer lines are intended to be maintained and updated in the future.
- <u>Street System:</u> Staff noted that the right-of-way proposed to be vacated would create a discontinuous section of right-of-way and limit the ability to access the property to the west in the future.
- <u>Pedestrian Access</u>: Staff noted that pedestrians can currently access the Skyline Drive Wilderness Area from this portion of right-of-way. Vacating this portion of right-of-way would limit the ability of pedestrians to access the Skyline Drive Wilderness Area.
- <u>Petitions</u>: This item was tabled at the May 25, 2006 Planning Commission Meeting since one of the required Petitions to Vacate Public Right-of-Way had not been returned. On June 21, 2006 the applicant submitted the required petitions.

Staff recommends that the Vacation of Right-of-Way be denied.
