Attached please find a grant application for Land and Water Conservation Funds in the amount of \$100,000 for play equipment in Vickie Powers Park. Matching Funds in the amount of \$50,000 have been identified from the TIF Proceeds for this park and will be expended through the CIP Parks and Recreation Line Item.

The LWCF program provides matching grants to States and local governments for the acquisition and development of public outdoor recreation areas and facilities. The program is intended to create and maintain a nationwide legacy of high quality recreation areas and facilities and to stimulate nonfederal investments in the protection and maintenance of recreation resources across the United States.

The Parks and Recreation Advisory Board authorized submittal of this grant application at their meeting on June 7th.

We are requesting that the Legal & Finance Committee approve this request and authorize staff to submit the grant application.

To All Public Officials:

This manual has been prepared to assist you in making applications for Land and Water Conservation Funds (LWCF) made available through the National Park Service and administered in South Dakota by the Department of Game, Fish and Parks. The manual is designed to familiarize you with the LWCF program as it relates to the development of community park and recreation projects.

The 2002-2007 Statewide Comprehensive Outdoor Recreation Plan (SCORP) outlines current recreation needs and priorities in South Dakota and can be viewed online at: www.sdgfp.info/parks. Projects must be supported either by the SCORP or a local recreation needs assessment. Because the SCORP broadly identifies recreational needs on a regional basis, it is possible that a community might have a need that the SCORP has not addressed. In order to qualify such a project for LWCF consideration, your community can conduct a local recreation needs assessment. We have developed a simple and acceptable method for assessing local needs and our staff can assist you in such an effort.

Please note the Open Project Selection Process Priority Rating System included in this manual. These are the criteria used during the review process to rate and score the proposed projects.

Grant applications are being accepted until July 15, 2007 for a minimum of \$5,000 and a maximum of \$50,000 in LWCF assistance. Requests for additional information, or any questions should be directed to Randy Kittle at (605)773-5490.
