This letter serves as the prescription for the fire hazard and fuels reduction treatment on your property located in the Copper Oaks Subdivision south of the city of Rapid City. The property is located at Township 1S, Range 7E, Section 7 in Pennington County, South Dakota.

The objective of this treatment is to reduce the threat of a catastrophic fire on the property by treating up to a 40 acre area that is being developed for residential structures on the north side of the Copper Oaks Subdivision. This treatment will improve upon the existing survivable space around the homes, thin the dense under story of precommercial and post/pole sized Ponderosa Pine, and remove fuels from the forest floor that may consist of snow bends, broken tree tops, branches, and other forest litter. This treatment will also improve forest health by removing unhealthy trees, lowering the risk of insect or disease outbreaks, and creating improved conditions for remaining trees, forbs, and shrubs.

The recommended treatment is to improve the survivable space around any structures for an area of at least 75-100 feet, with sparsely scattered trees remaining in this area if they are not immediately adjacent to the structure. The subject property is generally meeting this specification. The present threat to structures is from the heavy fuel loading in and around the adjacent area of development.

The remaining treatment on the property should include thinning existing Ponderosa Pine to a minimum spacing of 15-25 feet between crowns, when possible. Where there are areas of hardwoods on the property, their health, as well as, the diversity of the stand can be increased if pines are clear-cut at least 25 feet around hardwood trees. All snow-damaged trees should be cut. Larger dominate and co dominate trees that are straight, with good form and vigor, should be left if they meet the minimum spacing. Also remove trees that have active stem canker (Western Gall Rust), are snow bent, deformed, or have broken, dead or forked tops. It is recommended that trees with defects be removed first, with remaining trees being cut next until the desired spacing is

achieved. Trees within the prescription area should be limbed to a minimum of 10 feet from the ground. This will need to be increased on areas of steep slopes to ensure that the limbs on the uphill side are at least 10 feet above ground level.

Felled trees and limbs (thinning slash) and broken tops, as well as, other previously downed material will be removed, chipped and spread to a maximum 4" depth, or piled for later burning when conditions are favorable (with permit approval by SD Wildland Fire Suppression), and whatever the local housing authority has approved. We do not recommend piling of green slash between the months of April – September due to the favorable conditions it creates for Pine Engraver Beetle (Ips Beetle) infestation. It would be in your best interest to remove as much green slash as possible from the site, or cover slash piles in plastic if you decide to commence thinning during these months. Stumps should be no higher than 6 inches, and burn piles will not be located on top of stumps. The project will not be considered complete for cost-share reimbursement, until all fuels are eliminated through burning or removal unless other arrangements have been made with the Division.
