Comments:

5th and St Cloud was the proposed crossing for the participants, and the permit requests police monitor and close 5th street if necessary. After reviewing the route information and concerns from last year's event, I contacted Evan Waddell (event contact person). I proposed crossing 5th St at St Patrick Street rather than St Cloud, for two reasons. There is a hill and curve north of St Cloud St which obstructs clear view of the intersection for southbound traffic, which presents a safety concern for participants. In addition, there is a traffic signal light at 5th and St Patrick Street which offers additional control of traffic and a pedestrian crosswalk to ensure safe passage for participants. The 5th and St Cloud location would require at least two officers. The 5th and St Patrick location could easily be handled by one officer. Evan Waddell agreed and was relatively certain the "event committee" would not have a problem with the route change. He planned to contact committee members, and if there were any objections to the change, he would contact me to discuss further and if necessary, discuss at the City Council meeting.

At present, I recommend the slight route change of crossing at 5th and St Patrick Street and the event contact person (Evan Waddell) is in agreement.

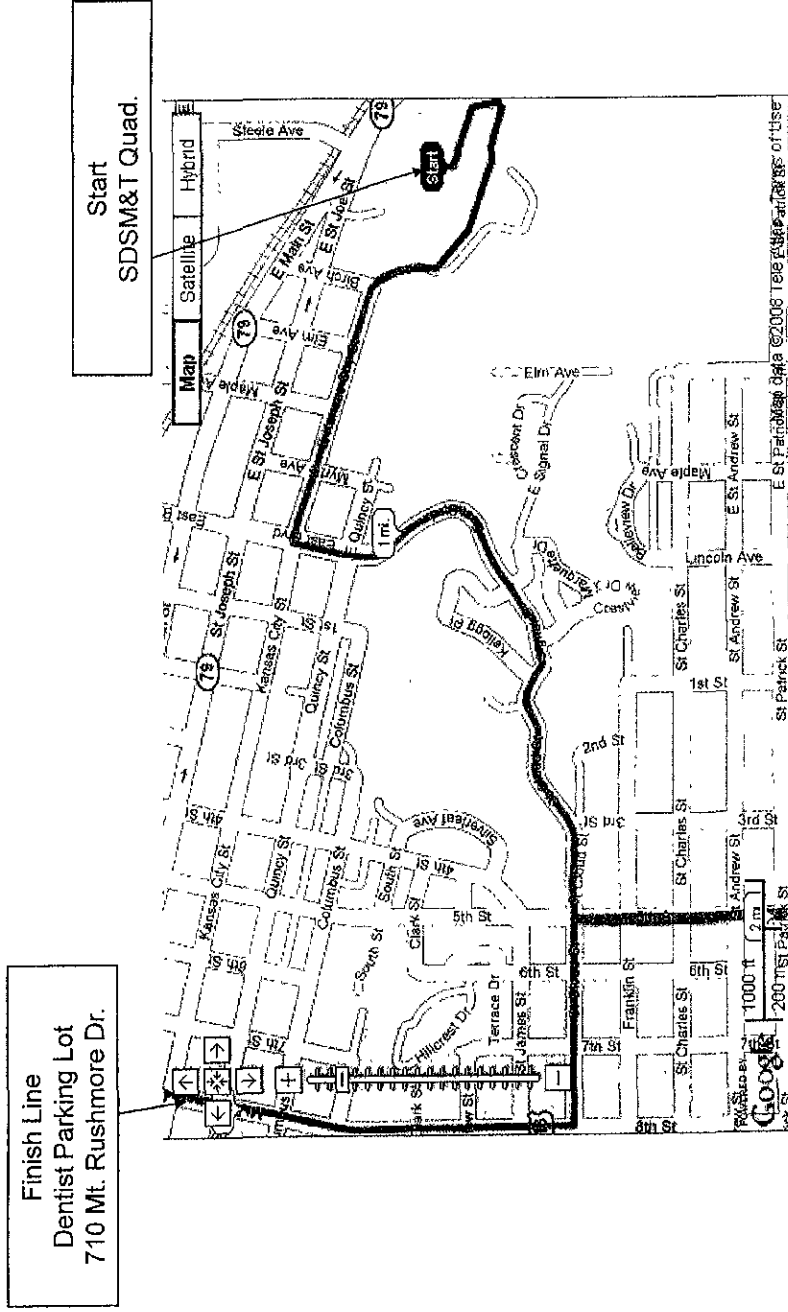

Additional Route Notes:

1. With the exception of St. Cloud, runners will be utilizing sidewalks for this race, and so the closure of main thoroughfares is not necessary. Additionally, student volunteers will be positioned along the route to ensure safe travel and to alert runners of potential hazards.
2. The only portion of the race which should be monitored closely by a traffic officer, and closed if necessary, is the 5th Street crossing on St. Cloud. Any traffic interference should be minimal, however, as participants will be well spaced at this point of the race.
3. The end of the race route occurs before the Kansas City Street – 8th intersection; participants will walk, using crosswalks, to the ending ceremony at Dublin Square.
4. Since the School of Mines and Dublin Square characterize this Saint Patrick's Day-themed race, the chosen route has been deemed ideal; note also that in its first two years, the Dublin Dash has not encountered any issues with safety or ostensible conflicts with drivers along this route. This is likewise expected for its third year.
5. Finally, the race has been scheduled one hour earlier this year to further minimize interference with morning traffic.
