NARRATIVE

In keeping with our philosophy that all children are capable of producing beautiful choral music, our program is open to all children (with unchanged voices, in the Rapid City area. Our goal is to provide various opportunities for each member to develop good choral techniques and behavior, stage presence and confidence. These qualities are expected in rehearsals, as well as at diverserse concert venues. It is the aim of the Rapid City Children's Chorus to be recognized as an outstanding example of an educational, choral program for children in our region.

Membership in the RC Chamber of Commerce has made our program known to potential residents and also convention planning committees. We are available and do perform at many civic activities.

A long term goal has been to expand our program to include younger children (1st and 2nd graders). However, lack of funds and qualified personnel have kept us from realizing this "dream."

Concert Choir singers returned from the Nashville "Crossroads Festival, with eagerness and excitement. As a result of our attendance at many festivals, our Chorus was invited to do a "virtual" taping of a composition, "How Many Christmases" in late October. The Rapid City Children's Chorus represented the state of South Dakota. Our tape was mixed with choirs from all over the globe and is on the CD "The Coolside of Yuletide." (Enclosed.) We were pleasantly surprised to learn we had sold the most CD's, thereby "winning" a song writing workship (to be held in Rapid City) with the composer, Jim Popoulis. A concert will follow the workshop.

We started this Season with a performance for the 60th anniversary of the Berlin Airlift Vet. Convention. The Chorus included in their concert an original piece of music, "Operation Vittles", written by Irving Berlin in honor of these men and their service.

As we look toward this next year, the Chorus is scheduled to sing at Mt. Rushmore for the national, "Wheelchair Miss America" pageant in August. Our tour plans for the 2009-2010 Season are tentative, but we do look for opportunities which will expand each chorister's musical development. We feel that children's chorus festivals do that for our singers. Not only do they meet other children with similar interests, but they are also exposed to nationally-known directors and composers. We have received invitations to attend festivals in Washington, D>C>, New Orleans, San Franciso, Jamestown, Vx., and New York City.
