Statement of Historical Significance: (Including Relation to Historic Context Topics and Study Units)

This property has the potential to contribute to the West Boulevard Historic District. It is significant for its association with the growth of and development of the West Boulevard neighborhood in Rapid City from 1878 to 1942. Built in 1912, the house corresponds with the rebuilding phase of residential development in Rapid City (1898 to 1929), a period in which the West Boulevard neighborhood rapidly grew in response to tremendous population growth in the city. The property illustrates the varied economic status of the neighborhood's inhabitants during this period and serves as a representative example of residential architecture popular at the time.

Miscellaneous Historical Information:

Historic research indicates that the house was built in 1912 by Henry Maisecamp. Although unconfirmed, it appears that Maisecamp was a contractor or speculative builder responsible for construction of several homes in the neighborhood including this one and the near identical house next door (WB-155).
