Dorm room for 10 (inadequate storage or sleeping arrangements)

Inadequate laundry facility for personal laundry and no ability for gear laundry (PPE)

Added services caused interior renovations (former training/meeting conference space)

EMS Billing space...no area for walk in customers, lack of storage and privacy issues for visitors (HIIPA)
