My thoughts on the CM@R program is that it is the only way to go on a large ticket construction item IF the city knows what they would like to achieve with the project. It locks in a price that is doable and allows the city to rest assured that they will receive the product they are seeking. It follows a similar format to a design build project except that you know up front what your costs will be. By included a small percentage of the total project cost as a contingency fee it allows for some changes to scope without exceeding the city budget. Only change orders initiated by the city are covered out of that account.

My experience with the Rec Center was that we knew going in what the deliverables were. The process was smooth, it was fast (three months from the interview we were under construction) and it was worry free. Any constructability problems that were discovered after construction was initiated were not billable to the city. I also believe it holds the contractor to a higher level of accountability which makes the selection process that much more critical. You need to select a competent and reliable contractor and designer for the project to succeed and meet your highest expectations.
