Items from Committee

Motion was made by Rolinger, seconded by Dreyer and carried to authorize installation of air monitoring equipment at the west side Fire Station on West Chicago Street.

Motion was made by Rolinger and seconded by Hanks to approve the Resolution to Provide Continued Seniority and Re-employment Rights. Johnson stated that he feels this resolution will create more strife between the City and County. If the departments are split, the transition should be smooth and with as few problems as possible. Ossenfort concurred and asked if the Resolution could be modified to deal with specific employees only. Elkins stated that the resolution will affect only existing city employees who will be moving to the County. Upon vote being taken, the motion carried with Johnson and Dreyer voting no.

Motion was made by Hanks and seconded by Ossenfort to approve the East Greenway Master Plan. Upon vote being taken, the motion carried unanimously.

Motion was made by Hanks and seconded by Dreyer to approve the Request for Determination that a **Detoxification Center** is appropriate as a Permitted Use in the Light Industrial Zoning District. Glen Plummer, George Chell, Sheriff Don Holloway and Dr. John Fox spoke in favor the request. The current facility provides a great service to the community, however, it has very limited space (only 57 beds). The community is in desperate need of a larger detox facility. Ray Laudenschlager supported the idea of requiring a use on review to give neighboring property owners an opportunity to provide input on the proposal. Doug Austin, Director of the Detox facility, stated that they have been good neighbors at their present location and they will be good neighbors at any new location. Ron Strode, area property owner, stated that it would be better to have a business in this location paying taxes rather than this use which would be tax exempt. Upon vote being taken, the motion carried unanimously.

Special Items and Items from Visitors

The next item before the Council was a request by Laura Armstrong that the City Council prepare and approve an ordinance that would prohibit blasting within the City limits. Motion was made by Ossenfort, seconded by Rolinger and carried to table this item.
