RECOMMENDATION:

Staff recommends that the Vacation of Right-of-Way be approved.

<u>GENERAL COMMENTS</u>: The applicant has submitted a Vacation of Right-of-Way request to vacate a portion of East Mall Drive west of the intersection of Tish Boulevard and East North Street. The proposed Vacation of Right-of-Way is located on the south side of East Mall Drive and extends a distance of approximately 3,400 feet.

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- <u>STAFF REVIEW</u>: Staff has reviewed the Vacation of Right-of-Way request and has noted the following considerations:
- <u>Engineering</u>: East Mall Drive is currently fully built. It appears that all street improvements are located in the remaining 124 feet of right-of-way. The minimum right-of-way required for East Mall Drive is 120 feet.
- <u>Transportation</u>: The East Mall Drive Preliminary Design Report identifies a minimum 120 foot of right-of-way required for the designed road section. The proposed Vacation of Right-of-Way maintains 124 feet of right-of-way.
- <u>Utilities</u>: The utility companies have indicated concurrence with the proposed Vacation of Right-of-Way.

Reducing the right-of-way width of east Mall Drive as proposed continues to provide a street section in compliance with the City's adopted plans and secures a utility corridor. As such, staff recommends that the Vacation of Right-of-Way be approved.
