Project Title: Secured 24 hour service area: Sub project of Citizen Campus

Description:

24-HR DROP-OFF

The City of Rapid City Solid Waste Division is proposing the installation of a secured 24-hour drop off facility located just outside the gates of the new entrance to the Citizen's Campus. This facility will eventually replace the existing drop-off facility located 2 miles north on Fairmont Blvd. The purpose of this facility is to provide residents with a secured area for recyclables and yard waste. The Citizen Campus and Landfill is open 7:00am – 4:45pm Monday through Friday, this area will allow the public to have a location open 24-hours a day, 7 days a week. The drop-off area will also be lighted and monitored with security cameras. This area will increase the visibility and accessibility for residents to recycle goods, such as cardboard and paper, plastics, glass, aluminum, steel and dispose of yard waste. Moving the facility from an offsite location to the landfill will also increase efficiency in the City's operations and ability to deter misuse of property.

Narrative City of Rapid City Solid Waste Department

Executive Summary

The City of Rapid City Solid Waste Department provides collection of solid waste and recycling to city residents and the surrounding region. The City of Rapid City Solid Waste Department also provides for waste reduction and recycling programs by making available a Materials Recycling Facility in conjunction with a municipal landfill. The Rapid City also provides for waste reduction and recycling programs by making available three drop-off sites for recyclables and yard waste. These facilities are available to residents and those living outside the city limits 24 hours a day. Due to the need for increased security measures the Rapid City's Solid Waste Operations is installing a 24-hour lighted and security camera monitored drop-off site. This facility will be located just outside the gates of the new entrance of the Citizen's Campus.

Project Narrative

This facility will provide a safe and secure area for community members of the Rapid City Planning Area to bring recyclables and yard waste to an area that will contribute to waste reduction in the regional landfill:

The Regional Landfill services an area that is comprised of the following areas:

Rapid City - Box Elder - Ellsworth Air Force Base – Hermosa - Hill city - New Underwood Keystone - Western portion of Unincorporated Pennington County - Portions of Unincorporated Meade County - Portions of Unincorporated Custer Counter

This 24-hour recycling drop off location will eventually replace the existing drop-off location located 2 miles north on Fairmont Blvd. The facility will curb illegal dumping and scavenging by the use of the 24-hour lighting and security camera's. The city of Rapid City will continue to support the other two existing drop off locations located at other areas of the city.

Budgetary Information

The overall budgetary scope of this project is submitted by Scull Construction who has presented a Statement of Values for the Citizen Campus Project (Appendix 2). This Statement of Value breakdown is budgeted as lump sum amounts. The amount requested is based on 24 Hour Area surfacing for a bid of \$126,000. This amount also includes \$20,000 for fencing. In the statement of values fencing is a lump sum of \$82,000. Based on the area surrounding the 24 hour area \$20,000 is needed for fencing. This is a total requested grant amount of \$146,000.

The entire Citizen Campus project is funded through monies from the Solid Waste Operations. There was an authorization to bid for four million by Rapid City Council. The entire project is \$3,969,000 million. With the subsidization of funds through this grant other not included portions of the citizen campus can be completed immediately without further delay.

Eligibility and Need

This project offers a safe and secure environment for residents and surrounding communities to drop off recyclable and participate in a plan that supports Waste Reduction. This project is a culmination of a long term planning process. The solid waste operations identified the problems

of illegal dumping and scavenging and community members' not feeling safe as the days grew shorter to take their recycling to one of the locations. Because of these the city set the goal to create a safe environment for its users and developed the plan to build and make available resources for recyclables.

Long Range Planning

The 24 Hour Area is a product of the new Citizen Campus which is a result of the Solid Waste Management Plan updated in January of 2010 and will be a work in progress. This plan was developed to keep Rapid City Solid Waste moving forward to continue to "provide for the orderly, efficient, and safe collection, recycling, and disposal of solid waste". This is a comprehensive solid waste management plan to address system needs for the next twenty years.
