Landfill Cell 13/14 Closure

- + Cap Cells 13 & 14 with compacted clay from on site sources
- + Bids due July 29- Estimated Cost \$1,000,000

Landfill Gas Well Installation - Cell 12

- + Expand existing landfill gas system to meet DENR compliance.
- + Bids due July 29- Estimated Cost \$1,000,000

Landfill Permitting- Johnson Property

- + 106 acres to south (purchased in 2003)
- + Expand existing landfill capacity to 2060

Recycling Expansion

- + Scale back Co-compost production
- + Future curbside cardboard and Newspaper collection
- + Commercial Recycling
- + Future recycling outside of City limits

Route Reorganization-Tentative January 1, 2015

- + Added 675 new accounts since January 2012
- + Growth on East (Elks Club and Homestead areas) and West (Carriage Hills)
