We trained with all the City Fire Dept personal and we all worked very well together. On Feb. 9, 1990 we had an air ambulance crash on take off. There were 4 people on board and the plane was instantly on fire. We got everyone out without any burns. The pilot died that night in the hospital. Without the training and the help of the City Fire Dept Fire Fighters to help with the extraction and taking care of the large grass fire, the out come would have been very different, I'm sure. I would highly recommend not ever splitting up the CFR Fire Fighters and the City Fire Fighters and expect the same results as we had.

I would like to take this opportunity to express my sincere appreciation for your outstanding performance of duties on February 9, 1990, at 11:14 A.M.

At that time an MU-2 medical evacuation aircraft crashed on take off with four persons on board. Immediately upon impact the aircraft burst into flames with extremely intense fire, heat, and smoke.

The mature judgment, profound skill and outright bravery displayed by yourself directly resulted in four lives being saved. Your actions in extracting the injured while putting out an extremely hot fire that could have exploded any second, were in my opinion, above and beyond the call of duty. These actions are in keeping with the highest of fire fighting standards and bring great credit to you and the Crash Fire and Rescue unit at the Rapid City Regional Airport and the entire Rapid City Fire Department.

Again, my personal thanks for your truly superb performance. I am requesting that this letter be placed in your permanent personnel file as a record of your truly professional performance.

Pursuant to due call and notice thereof, a regular meeting of the Common Council was held at the City/School Administration Center in Rapid City, South Dakota on Monday, February 19, 1990 at 7:00

Mayor Carlyle, Finance Officer Brugger and the following Alderpersons were present: Coffing, Weiland, Albrecht, Robinson, Hillard, Bailey, McLaughlin, Holbrook, Pappel and Kellar; the following arrived during the course of the meeting: None; and the following were absent: None.

WHEREAS on Friday, February 9, 1990, a medical evacuation airplane crashed at the Rapid City Regional Airport; and

WHEREAS Fire Fighter Andrew Duda and Lieutenant Don Clauson of the Rapid City Fire Department, assigned to the Rapid City Regional Airport, responded immediately and suppressed the fire which enveloped the wreckage and prevented the fire from entering the passenger compartment,

thereby making it possible to extricate the passengers from the airplane; and WHEREAS the Rapid City Fire

Department, Rapid City Police Department, the Box Elder Fire Department, the Rapid Valley Volunteer Fire Department, Regional Airport Maintenance Personnel, and Doctor Peter Maningas as medical director of the Emergency Medical Services Council responded in a spirit of cooperation and teamwork to suppress the grass fire which was started by the crash, to secure and control access to the crash site, and to extricate and transport the Injured passengers

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the City of Rapid City that the City hereby commends Fire Fighter Andrew Duda and Lieutenant Don Clauson for their performance in accordance with the highest standards of their

skill and training. BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the City commends and expresses its appreciation to the personnel involved in this outstanding display of teamwork and public service.
