Statement of Historical Significance: (Including Relation to Historic Context Topics and Study Units)

The Florence Peters House has the potential to contribute to the West Boulevar Historic District. It is significant for its association with the development of the West Boulevard neighborhood in Rapid City from 1878 to 1942. Built in 1930, the house corresponds to the Great Depression, a time of economic uncertainty across the nation. Rapid City experienced limited construction in the early Depression years. In the mid 1930s, however, its construction industry revived largely because of the city's relatively healthy and diverse economy; many new homes were built in the West Boulevard neighborhood. This house helps to illustrate the economic vitality of the city during the Depression, as well as the varied social and economic status of those living in the West Boulevard neighborhood. It also serves as a representative example of the Picturesque style, the vernacular variant of the various Revival styles that dominated domestic construction in country in the 1920s and 1930s. The Picturesque proved the most popular style used for small- and moderate-sized houses erected in the neighborhood during the 1930s.

Miscellaneous Historical Information:

Research indicates the house was built in 1930 for Florence Peters. The water permit issued during construction was obtain for Peters by "O'Niel & Carlson." These individuals likely represented the Henry Carlson Company, a Souix Falls- based general contracting firm that built several houses in the West Boulevard neighborhood in the late 1920s and 1930s, including at least four other houses in this block.
