Statement of Historical Significance: (Including Relation to Historic Context Topics and Study Units)

The Elsie White House has the potential to contribute to the West Boulevard Historic District. It is significant for its association with the growth and development of the West Boulevard neighborhood in Rapid City from 1878-1942. Built circa 1923 and enlarged in 1929, the house corresponds to the rebuilding phase of residential development in Rapid City (1897-1929), a period in which the West Boulevard neighborhood rapidly grew in response to tremendous population growth in the city. The house helps to illustrate the varied economic status of the neighborhood's inhabitants during this era. It also serves as a representative example of the Craftsman style, one of the most popular styles for domestic construction in the West Boulevard area in the 1910s and 1920s.

Miscellaneous Historical Information:

Research indicates the original unit of the house was built in 1922-23, or around the time that Elsie White received water and sewer permits for the property. The house was enlarged in about 1929, with the construction of a gabled-wing. Although unconfirmed, Elsie White was likely the original owner and conceivable is the "Elza," wife of C. Merle Rowe, shown at this address in the 1928 R.L. Polk.
