Statement of Historical Significance: (Including Relation to Historic Context Topics and Study Units)

This house has the potential to contribute to the West Boulevard Historic District. It is significant for its association with the development of the West Boulevard neighborhood in Rapid City from 1878 to 1942. Built in about 1941, the house corresponds to the Great Depression, a time of economic uncertainty across the nation. Rapid City experienced limited construction in the early Depression years. In the mid 1930s, however, its construction industry revived largely because of the city's relatively healthy and diverse economy; many new homes were built in the West Boulevard neighborhood. This house helps to illustrate the economic vitality of the city during the Depression, as well as the varied social and economic status of those living in the West Boulevard neighborhood. It also serves as a representative example of a vernacular style built in the neighborhood during this period.

Miscellaneous Historical Information:

Tax records for this house list a year-built date of 1941. Although not fully confirmed this seems appropriate; the house's Foursquare form and ornamental detailing do suggest pre-WWII construction.
