

**Minutes
Historic Sign Review Committee
February 6, 2015**

Blada called the meeting to order at 8:58 a.m.

523 Sixth Street (14SN031)

Hanzel reviewed the application information for a circular Starbucks pedestrian sign to be located on the corner of the Alex Johnson Hotel, a contributing structure built in 1928.

Fenhaus moved to approve the installation of a 3' diameter internally illuminated LED pedestrian sign, with the mounting brackets as identified in Option A. The motion was seconded by Jackson.

Paul Bradsky noted that the sign would be a double sided, internally illuminated, 3' diameter pedestrian sign installed on the corner of the structure with the bracket style identified in Option A.

The motion to approve the installation of a 3' diameter internally illuminated LED pedestrian sign, with the mounting brackets as identified in Option A, carried unanimously.

815 Saint Joseph Street (15SN003)

Hanzel reviewed the application information for three wall signs and a pedestrian sign. The non-listed structure built in 1958 is located within the environs of the District.

Kingsbury moved to approve the installation of three wall signs on the west façade, and a pedestrian sign on the north façade of the structure. The motion was seconded by Jackson.

In response to a question from Kingsbury, Bjerke noted that the wall signs would be flush to the building and attached in the same manner as the existing signs, with no significant projection from the building or lighting of the sign, other than the existing parking lot lights.

The motion to approve the installation of three "Alumex" wall signs on the west façade, and an "Alumex" pedestrian sign on the north façade carried unanimously.

617 Main Street (15SN004)

Hanzel reviewed the application information to move an existing wall sign and pedestrian sign to a contributing structure built in 1926.

Kingsbury moved, Jackson seconded and motion carried unanimously to approve moving the existing wall sign and pedestrian sign from the current location at 524 7th Street to 617 Main Street.

509 7th Street (15SN005)

Hanzel reviewed the application information to install a wall sign and a pedestrian sign to a non-contributing structure built in 1998.

Fenhaus moved and Jackson seconded a motion to approve installing an 8' x 2' wood wall sign and a 1' x 3' wood pedestrian sign.

In response to a question from Kingsbury, Burdis and Rose shared that the signs would not be installed on the Sweeney building bricks, but in the same location as the previous sign.

The motion to approve the installation of an 8' x 2' wood wall sign and a 1' x 3' wood pedestrian signs carried unanimously.
