This memo is to provide you with further information regarding the proposed renaming of "North Street" to "Fillmore Street." After completion of the Staff Report a letter was received from Mr. Joe Sollid regarding this matter (see attached). Mr. Sollid is one of the affected property owners who was notified regarding this proposed street renaming. Mr. Sollid has recommended two alternative names: 1) Gold Street, and 2) Sollid Street. Staff has reviewed the proposed names and identified the following concerns. There is already a "Gold Street" in the vicinity of North Street but it does not align with North Street. Renaming this street to "Gold Street" would result in a duplication of street names and confusion for the public as well as emergency responders. The Emergency Services Dispatch Center has indicated that "Sollid Street" would lead to confusion due to misspelling. Further, there may be concerns with the appropriateness of naming the street after just one of its residents.

The Staff recommendation is that "North Street" be renamed to "Fillmore Street."


