 Mosquito Control Grant Agreement

This agreement is entered into on this 9th day of May, 2005 by and between the Department of Health of 600 East Capitol Avenue, Pierre, SD 57501 (**DOH**) and the Primary Applicant - Rapid City of 300 6th St, Rapid City, SD 57702 (hereinafter referred to as "**Control Program**".)

DOH and the **Control Program** hereby enter into an Agreement pursuant to the terms and conditions set forth below and subject to 2005 Session Law, Chapter 55.

1. Funds are being provided by **DOH** to the **Control Program** for the sole use of purchasing mosquito control chemicals as described in the **Control Program's** comprehensive mosquito control plan and 2005 budget.
2. Funds are for up to one / half the **Control Program's** cost of eligible mosquito control chemicals.
3. **Control Program's** total award not to exceed \$9507.90. Funds will be awarded in the following manner:
 - Upon **Control Program's** submission and **DOH** receipt of the signed agreement, **DOH** will return to the **Control Program**; one signed original and the total award. All other receipts relative to the **Control Program's** operations shall be retained locally by the **Control Program** for a period of two years.
4. Chemical purchases under this grant agreement become the sole property and responsibility of the **Control Program**.
5. Where possible, the **Control Program** agrees to provide **DOH** with relevant electronic data obtained during the conduct of control efforts. This includes GIS data regarding light trap locations, trap counts, larval counts with GIS locations, GIS data of larvacide and adulticide applications, GIS locations of bird submissions, and efficacy data. SDSU has developed a Web-based mosquito population graphing program at <http://www.ces.sdstate.edu/mosqcount/> to assist in evaluation of mosquito population trends.

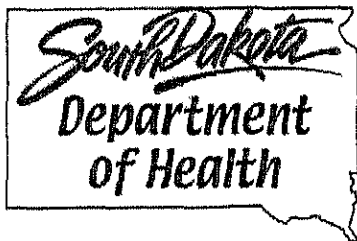

Thank you for your continued efforts in West Nile prevention and mosquito control in your community. I am confident, by working together we will limit West Nile disease in South Dakota.

We are please to inform you that you grant application for mosquito control funds has been reviewed and approved. Enclosed is the agreement with the Department of Health. This agreement should be reviewed to ensure funds are spent according to your plan and budget as submitted.

The total award check you will be receiving as part of the Mosquito Control Grant will be provided to you upon submission of a signed agreement. A cutoff date of August 31, 2005 has been set for all mosquito control grant payments. It is not necessary to submit receipts for chemicals. We do however ask that you retain those records locally for a period of two years.

Monitoring of mosquito populations should be an important part of a public mosquito control program. Changes in populations should be used to trigger adult mosquito control, instead of spraying by the calendar. To assist with evaluation of population trends, SDSU Cooperative Extension has developed a Web-based mosquito population graphing program.
