We would like to request the use of our HUD funding be extended until March 2007. The number of youths passing through our program is less than expected as some have stayed longer than anticipated. This means that funds were not used due to fewer turnovers.

We would also like to request that funds be used for youths while in the program for purposes such as supplemental food purchases and clothing. There is a need to buy additional work clothing for some of the program participants who change jobs, due to the different dress requirements. Most participants do not earn much per hour and when working in food service or car detailing, hours can unexpectedly be cut, making it difficult to plan for expenses such as rent or restitution. Although food stamps are a big help, some participants find there is a need for additional food during the month.

Many of our young people are trying to be independent, have good work ethics, and follow the program rules. However, employment can be erratic through no fault of theirs and a little help can go a long way toward achieving their goals and their understanding of living in a compassionate community. Thank you for consideration of this request.
