Dear Sergeant Booth,

On May 2nd and 3rd of 2008, the South Dakota State Historical Society will be holding its annual meeting and history conference here in Rapid City at the Ramkota Hotel. This year's theme is "Fur Trade: Empires on the Plains". Attendance is typically in the range of 150 participants. When the conference is held in Rapid City, attendance is typically higher. Our goal is to have 200+ attendees.

A reception has been scheduled for the evening of May 2nd at Prairie's Edge. As part of the South Dakota State Historical Society's history conference we are requesting a street closure between 5:00 p.m. and 9:00 p.m. of Sixth Street from Main Street north to Alley A and use of the west end of the City-owned parking lot for a fur trade era living history demonstration. Our schedule has not been finalized as of the date of this letter, however, our current schedule has the demonstrations taking place during and after the reception from 6:00 p.m. to 8:00 p.m. These educational demonstrations will be open to the general public, free of charge. Teachers earning their continuing education credits and Historical Society members will form the bulk of the attendees. We have requested the assistance of the Muzzleloaders of the Black Hills to conduct these living history demonstrations. This particular facet of our conference is scaleable and is dependent on the demonstrations, space and resources available. We request to be permitted to have the Muzzleloaders of the Black Hills discharge blanks from their period reproduction guns as part of this educational demonstration.
