Statement of Historical Significance: (Including Relation to Historic Context Topics and Study Units)

The Theodore & Caroline Johanson House has the potential to contribute to the West Boulevard Historic District. It is significant for its association with the growth and development of the West Boulevard neighborhood in Rapid City from 1878-1942. Built in 1925, the house corresponds to the rebuilding phase of residential development in Rapid City (1897-1929), a period in which the West Boulevard neighborhood rapidly grew in response to tremendous population growth in the city. The house helps to illustrate the varied economic status of the neighborhood's inhabitants during this era and serves as a representative example of residential architecture common at the time.
