### **RECOMMENDATION:**

Staff recommends that the SDCL 11-6-19 Review to construct a 14 inch water main be approved.

### **GENERAL COMMENTS:**

The applicant has submitted an SDCL 11-6-19 Review to construct 14 inch water main loop from Elk Vale Road to East Saint Charles Street. The proposed project is a City of Rapid City project located in public right-of-way starting near the intersection of East Saint Charles Street and South Valley Drive and extending to the intersection of Elk Vale Road and Homestead Street.

South Dakota Codified Law 11-6-19 states that "...whenever any such municipal council has adopted a comprehensive plan, then no street, park or other public way, ground, place, space, no public building or structure, no public utility, whether publicly or privately owned, if covered by the comprehensive plan or any adopted part thereof, shall be constructed or authorized in the municipality or within its subdivision jurisdiction until and unless the location and extent thereof shall have been submitted to and approved by the Planning Commission". The proposed utility extension is a public improvement and the property is identified as being located within the area covered by the Rapid City Comprehensive Plan requiring that the improvements be reviewed and approved by the Rapid City Planning Commission.

#### STAFF REVIEW:

Staff has reviewed the SDCL 11-6-19 and has noted the following considerations:

- <u>Air Quality Permit</u>: Staff noted that more than an acre of land is being disturbed and that an Air Quality Permit is required prior to construction.
- Right-of-Way Permits: Staff noted that the proposed construction will occur along streets under the jurisdiction of both the City of Rapid City and the State of South Dakota. The appropriate Right-of-Way Permits must be obtained prior to construction.
- <u>Floodplain Development Permit</u>: Staff noted a portion of the project is located in the 100 year floodplain and a Floodplain Development Permit must be obtained prior to construction.
- <u>Water main</u>: Public Works staff has reviewed the proposed water main project and noted that construction plans have been reviewed and approved. Staff also noted that a geotechnical report has been reviewed and approved for the trenching, backfill, and corrosion protection.
- <u>Fire Safety</u>: Rapid City Fire Department staff noted that fire hydrants shall be located as per the 2003 International Fire Code.

Staff recommends that the SDCL 11-6-19 Review be approved for the construction of a 14 inch water main.
