
The Pennington County Sheriff's Office requests approval to utilize the west 1/3 "approximately 1,000 square feet" of the building located at 230 Quincy Street Lot 17 – 22, Block 108 of the original town side of Rapid City for a testing site for breath and urinalysis tests from individuals on bond and probation for driving while intoxicated and/or other offenses as directed by the court. The program is currently running about 700 plus participants, with 409 reporting two times per day for breath tests. There are 59 participants that only report for the morning testing and 81 participants that only report for the evening testing. There are 100 plus participants scheduled for UA tests which can be from one to three times a week and 40 plus participants on electronic monitoring bracelet.

Most of the participants in the 24/7 Program have been charged with DUI (477) some have been convicted and this is part of their sentence and others are pre-trial and it is a bond condition. All tests are run between 6:00 am to 9:00 am and 5:00 pm to 9:00 pm, the people who are put on electric monitor may be there to get their bracelet at other times.

The west end of the building had previously been utilized for storage by National American University. The remainder of the building continues to be utilized by National American University, approximately 1,400 square feet for storage and 1,000 square feet for small animal exercise in conjunction with their education program. The staff and students associated with the small animal exercise area come from the National American University Veterinary Clinic located at 201 Kansas City St.

The maximum staff on duty at any one time will be four. The adjacent parking lot has 31 parking spaces, including one handicapped space. There are an additional 61 parking spaces owned by National American University located ½ block east of 230 Quincy at 2nd and Quincy. The 24/7 participants are complete by 9:00 am, which is prior to National American University utilization of the parking and resume at 5:00 pm after National American University has completed classes for the day. I request a waiver for any landscape requirements that might be associated

with this application or any additional parking requirement. My observation of the current operation indicates there is ample parking for the participants as they are coming and going throughout the testing times.
