<u>RECOMMENDATION</u>: Staff recommends that the Vacation of Major Drainage Easement be

approved.

<u>GENERAL COMMENTS</u>: The applicant is requesting to vacate a portion of a major drainage easement located on the north and east boundaries of the property. The subject property is undeveloped and is located near the upper end of the Robbinsdale Drainage Basin. It is located in a Heavy Industrial Zoning District. The zoning surrounding this property is also Heavy Industrial.

A channel was constructed along the north and east sides of the subject property to allow for drainage and fill has been added to the property. By developing the channel to carry the required flow of water for the drainage area, the subject property was eligible for a map revision from the Federal Emergency Management Agency. The 100 year peak discharge remains at 1390 cfs. The applicant has obtained a Letter of Map Revision from the Federal Emergency Management Agency to allow the requested area to be removed from the Special Flood Hazard Area.
