Engineering Division Request to Solicit PROPOSALS for EAST ANAMOSA STREET EXTENSION LaCrosse Street to Century Road

PROJECT NO. ST04-1397 CIP #50316

PROJECT DESCRIPTION

The City of Rapid City proposes to construct an extension to East Anamosa Street, from the intersection with LaCrosse Street easterly and southerly to an intersection with Century Road, which will be an arterial street section approximately 0.6 mile in length.

This project shall include grading for seven (7) lanes, drainage, storm sewer, PCC or AC surfacing for five (5) lanes including the turn-lane, curb & gutter, sidewalk, bike path, pavement markings, street lighting, signalization, an 8" sanitary sewer main, a 12" high-level water main, a 16" low-level water main, a grade-separated railroad crossing structure, and right-of-way acquisition.

The interim 5-lane street section is to be evaluated without and with a median constructed which will match or transition to the continuing roadway segments presently designed for the section immediately to the east of this project (the segments between Century Blvd and East North Street).

Design criteria for this roadway, structure, and utilities infrastructure project shall include the various City of Rapid City design criteria manuals, the Policy on Geometric Design of Highways and Streets, the Ten States Standards, master plans and/or studies.

Additional background information includes the East Anamosa Street Extension Study, the Northeast Area Analysis, the preliminary design report for the East Mall Drive Project, the Rapid City Major Street Plan, and any other relevant planning documents.

The project currently has an estimated total budget of $\frac{6,824,000}{6,824,000}$, including design and construction. The funding for the preliminary design only (200,000) has been identified, with 50% by the City and 50% by the developers. Final funding for the total construction has not been identified.

Funding for the project construction may be in part from the Street Improvement Fund, Drainage Improvement Fund, Water Enterprise Fund, Sewer Enterprise Fund, 2012 Fund, affected property owners or land developers, etc.
