INTRODUCTION

Tax Increment Financing is a method of financing improvements and development in an area which has been determined to be blighted according to the criteria set forth in SDCL 11-9. All this is done without incurring a general obligation for the taxpayers of the entire City.

The assessed value of a district is determined by the South Dakota Department of Revenue at the time the district is created by the City Council. This valuation is termed the Tax Increment Base Valuation for the district, or simply the "base valuation." As the property taxes for the property are paid, that portion of the taxes paid on the Base Valuation continue to go to those entities, (City, County, School, etc.), which levy property taxes.

When in succeeding years, the assessed valuation of the district increases, the total property taxes paid by the owners of property in the district will increase accordingly. That increase in taxable valuation is the "increment." When the tax bills are paid, only that portion of the tax bill which results from the Base Valuation, is paid to the taxing entities. The remainder of the tax bill, known as the tax increment, is deposited in a special fund. It is this plan which determines how these accumulated funds will be used. It is anticipated that one or more of the properties in this proposed Tax Increment District will be used for commercial purposes. The creation of this Tax Increment District for economic development purposes will not require an additional levy to make up for the School District's share of the property taxes included in the Tax Increment.

This financing method is invaluable for encouraging growth and development of blighted properties with special re-development problems, since the amount of funds available for use by the project plan is directly related to the increase in valuation which a given project or development will create.

OVERVIEW

This plan proposes that a Tax Increment District be created for public improvements to assist with grading and storm sewer piping within the Plum Creek development. Additionally, the applicant is proposing that the City would recover oversizing costs associated with their portion of the costs in the public improvements. The boundaries are located at the southern terminus of South Valley Drive. In addition, the Project Plan includes oversizing costs associated with the extension of Minnesota Street and funding for recreation infrastructure. The estimated cost of the improvements is \$1,900,000.

The Tax Increment Financing Committee met on September 29, 2005 and on October 14, 2005 to discuss the proposed Tax Increment District. In addition, the City Council has included the City's oversizing costs to extend Minnesota Street and to provide recreation infrastructure. The developer's cost for their portion of the improvements is \$900,000. The anticipated cost for the City's portion of the improvements is \$1,000,000.

The development of the public improvements will enhance the ability for new development to occur in this area increasing the community's economic vitality and expanding the City's property tax base.

Tax Increment District 57 Project Plan

The applicant's share of the estimated cost of the improvements will be financed at an estimated 9% interest rate. The City's estimated cost will be financed at a 6% interest rate. All project expenditures must be completed within five years. Should the tax increment revenues exceed the anticipated loan payments, the district debt would be retired early resulting in the full value of the property being returned to the tax rolls more quickly.

PROJECT PLAN SUMMARY

This plan establishes the total project costs, as well as the Tax Increment District funded costs.

Elements of the Project Plan

This Project Plan, as required by SDCL 11-9-13, will address the following elements:

- 2) Economic Feasibility Study;

The Statement of Method for Relocating Displaced Persons, as well as the Statement of Changes Needed in Master Plan, Building Codes and Ordinances do not apply to this Project Plan and have not been included in this document.

ELEMENTS OF THE PROJECT PLAN

1. PUBLIC WORKS AND OTHER IMPROVEMENTS

The project plan includes \$1,900,000 in costs associated with the proposed infrastructure improvements. The developer will fund 47% of the costs at \$900,000 and the City will fund 53% of the costs at \$1,000,000. However, for simplicity, the funds are proposed to be distributed on a 50-50 basis. The enclosed amortization schedules are based on the 50-50 revenue sharing.

2. ECONOMIC FEASIBILITY STUDY

<u>Current Valuation</u> – Tax Increment District Number Fifty Seven is proposed for creation in accordance with SDCL 11-9-2 to 11-9-11. A vicinity map as well as a boundary map is attached. As of this date, the assessed valuation for the proposed district is projected as \$93,534. In accordance with SDCL 11-9-20, certification of the base value will be requested from the South Dakota Department of Revenue following creation and approval of the district by the City Council.

Revenue Estimates from Tax Increments

The Plan anticipates 40 semi-annual payments over 20 years with a balance due of \$42,201.13. However, because of the uncertainty associated with the development, the plan may not be paid within a 20 year schedule. No further payments will be made after 20 years and any balance due at that time will be the responsibility of the developer as will be written in the Developer's Agreement. The potential negative short-term impact on the various taxing entities will be offset by the increase in the tax base in future years.

3. PROJECT COSTS

<u>Capital Costs</u> – The capital costs of \$1,900,000 for the Project Plan includes the funding to assist with grading and storm sewer piping improvements located at the southern terminus of South Valley Drive, oversizing costs for the extension of Minnesota Street and recreation infrastructure improvements.

<u>Financing Costs</u> – The financing costs for this Project Plan are dependent on the interest rate obtained. The anticipated interest rate used for this projection is 6% for the City and 9% for the applicant acquired financing. It is estimated that the financing costs will total \$2,832,173.06. If a lower interest rate is obtained, the project costs will be repaid more quickly and the property will be returned to the tax rolls sooner.

<u>Professional Service Costs</u> – No professional service costs are anticipated in the Project Plan.

Relocation Costs – No relocation costs are anticipated in the Project Plan.

Organizational Costs – No organizational costs are anticipated in the Project Plan.

Contingency Costs – No contingency costs are anticipated in the Project Plan.

<u>Necessary and Convenient Payments</u> – No necessary and convenient costs are anticipated in the Project Plan.

<u>Imputed Administrative Costs</u> – All Tax Increment District actions require municipal staff time to prepare and enact. The City shall be reimbursed on January 15, 2011, for its administrative costs in the amount of \$2050. However, in no case shall the City be reimbursed less than \$1 on January 15, 2011.

4. FISCAL IMPACT STATEMENT

The impact on taxing entities can be derived from determining the tax increment anticipated during the life of the district. The true impact on taxing entities of the Plan is the increase in valuation of the property within the Tax Increment District. The taxing entities are only foregoing that income during the life of the district and will realize that income as soon as the debt from the project costs in the Plan is retired. The purpose of this Plan is to encourage that increase in valuation.

At first glance it may appear that the negative impact on the various entities is notable. But when it is considered that without the use of the Tax Increment Finance proposed in this plan it is very likely that there would be no increase in the taxable value of the property within this district or, at least, any increase would be significantly delayed, the impact can be considered truly positive.

5. FINANCING METHOD

The financing method to be used in the funding of this Plan is to be obtained by the applicants for their share of the costs and by the City for the City's share of the costs. The applicants and the City will be responsible for any interest payments due for their

share of the costs that are not available from Tax Increment District #57 on a percentage of total project costs. If the tax increment revenues exceed the anticipated loan payments, the debt will be retired early.

The debt on the Tax Increment District Project Costs covered in the Plan will be retired by deposits made in the Tax Increment District as taxes are paid on the property in succeeding years. The City of Rapid City Finance Officer will make the disbursements from that fund in accordance with this Plan. Fifty percent of the revenues received will be disbursed to the City of Rapid City for project costs incurred by the City and fifty percent will be disbursed to the developer for project costs incurred by the developer until the developer's portion is repaid. According to SDCL 11-9-25, positive tax increments will be allocated to that fund until the debt from the project costs is retired or fifteen years following the last expenditure from the Project Plan whichever comes first. The final payment from this Plan is scheduled to be made on December 1, 2025. In the event that the project costs are not repaid within the 20 year schedule, the developer will be responsible for their share of any unpaid project costs.

There are two projected amortization rate schedules listed below. Schedule #1 shows the amount to be borrowed by the City using a 6% interest rate. Schedule #2 shows the amount to be borrowed by the applicant using a 9% interest rate.
