<u>RECOMMENDATION</u>: Staff recommends that the Vacation of Utility Easement be approved.

<u>GENERAL COMMENTS</u>: The applicant has submitted a Vacation of Utility Easement request to vacate a portion of an existing water main easement on Tract A in the NW1/4 NW1/4 of Section 11, T1N, R7E, located between the terminus of West Flormann Street and Skyline Drive.

The property was originally platted in 1972 and identified an east-west water main location. The applicant is now proposing to vacate a portion of the water main easement and create a new water main easement where the main was actually constructed in 1999. The property is located between the terminus of West Flormann Street and Skyline Drive. A residential structure is located approximately 150 feet north of the existing water main.

<u>STAFF REVIEW</u>: Staff has reviewed the Vacation of Utility Easement and has noted the following considerations:

<u>Utilities</u>: As previously noted, an east-west water main is located approximately 100 feet north of the southern boundary. A portion of the water main was constructed outside of the water main easement recorded in 1951. This application will ensure that the City's water main is located within the recorded utility easement.

The property owner(s) has signed the Permanent Utility Easement document creating an easement for the existing water main and it has been forwarded to the Register of Deed's Office for recording. As such, staff recommends approval of the Vacation of Utility Easement request for the water main easement.
