## No. 10VE008 - Vacation of a portion of a Utility and Drainage ITEM Easement

## **RECOMMENDATION**:

Staff recommends that the Vacation of a portion of a Utility and Drainage Easement be approved with the following stipulation:

- 1. Prior to Public Works Committee approval, the applicant shall submit a drainage report for review and approval, which demonstrates that the remaining easement can accommodate the anticipated drainage flows.
- <u>GENERAL COMMENTS</u>: The applicant has submitted a Vacation of a Utility and Drainage Easement request to vacate a portion of the existing easement located along the west lot line of the property.

## No. 10VE008 - Vacation of a portion of a Utility and Drainage ITEM Easement

The property was originally platted in 1990. The plat document notes there are 8 foot utility and drainage easements on the interior side of all side and rear lot lines. An existing single family residence is located within a 1 foot by 20 foot portion of the utility and drainage easement along the west property line.

The property is located at 806 Marie Court and is developed with a single family home, which was constructed in 1990.

- <u>STAFF REVIEW</u>: Staff has reviewed the Vacation of a Utility and Drainage Easement request and has noted the following considerations:
- <u>Utilities</u>: The affected utility companies have indicated concurrence with the request to vacate the utility easement.
- <u>Drainage</u>: The applicant has not submitted a Drainage Report for review and approval. As such, staff recommends that prior to Public Works Committee approval, the applicant must submit a drainage report for review and approval, which demonstrates that the remaining easement can accommodate the anticipated drainage flows.

Staff recommends that the Vacation of a portion of a Utility and Drainage Easement request be approved with the above noted stipulation.
