RECOMMENDATION:

Staff recommends that the Vacation of Utility and Minor Drainage Easement be approved.

GENERAL COMMENTS:

The applicant has submitted a Vacation of Utility and Minor Drainage Easement request to vacate portions of the previously platted eight foot wide Utility and Minor Drainage Easement located along the south and west lot lines of the property.

The property is located in the southwest corner of the intersection of E. Chicago Street and N. Maple Avenue. Currently, two commercial structures are located on the property.

STAFF REVIEW:

Staff has reviewed the Vacation of Utility and Minor Drainage Easement request and has

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noted the following considerations:

<u>Utilities</u>: The applicant has submitted written documentation identifying that all of the affected utility companies are in concurrence with the Vacation of Utility and Minor Drainage Easement request.

<u>Drainage</u>: The applicant has submitted drainage information identifying that the minor drainage easement located along the south and west lot line are not needed to accommodate drainage on the property.

<u>Structures</u>: Portions of the two structures located on the property currently encroach into the existing utility and minor drainage easement located along the west and south lot line of the property. The applicant has submitted a Vacation Exhibit showing the vacation of only that portion of the easement that is encroached upon by the existing structures. This complies with the previous actions of the City Council, where the balance of the easement is retained for future use as needed.

Staff recommends that the Vacation of Utility and Minor Drainage Easement be approved as proposed.
