
Mission Statement: The Journey Museum is the region's education venue that serves as a forum to preserve and explore the heritage of the cultures of the Black Hills region and the knowledge of its natural environment so residents and visitors can understand the values of our past, enrich our present, and meet the challenges of the future.



- The Journey Board has a strategic plan
- Working toward a management & lease agreement
- City established Museum Alliance of Rapid City (MARC) in the mid-1990s
- City Intent for the "Journey" [Museum] was to be a tourist attraction
- MARC Control of the collections was not essential.

- Journey has four major prehistoric and historic collections
 - Tell the complete story of the Western Great Plains from the perspective of the Lakota people and the pioneers who shaped its past, to the scientists who now study it.
 - The collections have archeological, cosmos, geology/paleontology, Sioux Indian and western native gardens and South Dakota's first century of flight

- Five institutions that make up the Journey Museum
 - The Museum of Geology on the campus of the South Dakota School of Mines & Technology
 - South Dakota Historical Society's Archeology Research
 Center
 - US Department of Interior, Indian Arts and Craft Board's Sioux Indian Museum
 - Minnilusa Historical Association
 - The City of Rapid City Duhamel Plains Indian Artifact Collection

- Sioux Indian Museum is funded through the Secretary of Interior budget as a line item not through a granting process
 - Federal line item funds the three museums, the Commissioners expenses and the largest portion of the budget funds enforcement of the 1990 Indian Arts and Crafts Law
 - Federal Government enforces the integrity of Native American arts and crafts making counterfeiting of these art objects by non-Natives a felony

- The issue for the Journey Museum and the City of Rapid City is that the Sioux Indian collection is exclusively controlled by the Federal Government
 - MARC (Museum Alliance of Rapid City) has no say in what is displayed, the signage and rotation policies of the collection
