SUBJECT: SCBA Disposal

The Rapid City Fire Department wishes to dispose of the following equipment:

30- complete MSA Self Contained Breathing Apparatus (SCBA) Condition from good to poor.
6- extra 2216 psi SCBA bottles
45- SCBA face pieces, assorted sizes
4- partial SCBA harnesses for parts
1- SCBA portable bench tester
Several boxes of assorted pieces, parts, & accessories

The “good” complete units have limited value, as they no longer meet the current NFPA standards. The “poor” units have little or no value. I would estimate we have about 6 units that I would rate as good. I would estimate their value to be \$250 per unit. The others would be estimated at \$100 per unit. The extra bottles are at, or near, the end of their serviceable life so they would have no value. The face pieces I would place a value of \$5ea. The bench tester is no long recognized by NFPA as a viable tester, so it has no value. The pieces & parts may have a value of \$200 total to someone.

Our intention is to give some or most of these units to area Volunteer Fire Departments that do not have enough, or may have no SCBA’s at all. We started getting requests when the information got out that we were replacing our SCBA’s.
