Flanking the central section are three buy wings with words in both the second and third stones. Panels of soldier brick segarate the second and third those. A stone name plate with "HAINES BLOCK" is certiced below the stone cornice. The crenelated parapet has a stone coping and 1918 datestone certered in the tocade.
