Dear Mr. Ellis,

The Leadership Rapid City (LRC) Class of 2006 is developing a walking path on the lot adjacent to the Rapid City Humane Society (see attached graphical depiction and brochure). The purpose of this project is to provide a suitable and safe environment for humane society volunteers to train and exercise dogs from the facility. Additionally, the park will be available to the community at large similar to the popular dog park on the west side of town near the Cleghorn Springs Fish Hatchery.

The class has raised nearly \$5,000 for this project. In order to complete the project within these funds, we are respectfully requesting a donation of approximately 300 tons of asphalt millings from the city of Rapid City. The LRC class will be responsible for hauling the millings to the Humane Society work site but will need a front end loader to help load the millings at the city landfill site. When completed, the path will include approximately 2,500 linear feet of walking trail 5 feet wide and packed with a 4 inch thick layer of asphalt millings. See the attached flyer for more details.


