

Rediscover Historic Downtown Rapid City Making Preservation Work

The Rapid City Historic Preservation Commission will join thousands of individuals around the country as part of a nationwide celebration of 2007 National Preservation Month in May. "Making Preservation Work!" is the theme of the month-long celebration, which is sponsored by the National Trust for Historic Preservation. In South Dakota May is celebrated as Archaeology and Historic Preservation Month.

The Rapid City Historic Preservation Commission is adding to the National Trust's 2007 theme with "Rediscover Historic Downtown Rapid City". A month of activities is planned starting in the lobby at city hall on May 1st with an exhibit containing 15 panels of historic photographs, documents and objects that educate visitors about the State's historic properties by sharing the sites, stories and special places of South Dakota.
