Arts Organizations

A Cappella Showcase (ACS)

Presents an annual Christmas Showcase in support of various community needs.

Bells of the Hills (BOH)

Presents two handbell concerts annually. Provides music education and outreach Programs.

BH Chamber Music Society (BHCMS)

Presents a chamber music season featuring local/regional professional players. Co-sponsors the Young Vocal Artist. Provides free concerts for elementary kids and “Elder Musik” for seniors.

BH Community Theatre (BHCT)

Fields a main stage season of theatrical works. Presents Cherry Street Players Youth Troupe. Hosts theater classes & camps for adults & children. Produces children’s theater at Storybook Island.

BH Dance Theatre (BHDT)

Presents nationally recognized dance companies. Sponsors dance workshops & scholarships. Presents *The Nutcracker*.

BH Playhouse (BHP)

Presents a full summer season of professional theater in Custer State Park.

BH Pow Wow (BHPW)

Presents an impressive Native American cultural event, showcasing Native American singers and dancers from throughout the USA and Canada.

BH Symphony Orchestra (BHSO)

Presents a full season of orchestral concerts. Provides a free, Fourth Grade Concert for public, private & reservation students. Sponsors the Young Artist Competition, giving young players performance and scholarship opportunities.

Dakota Artists Guild DAG)

Encourages community art through exhibits and education. Sponsors student scholarships & awards.

Dakota Choral Union (DCU)

Provides a non-auditioned community choir. Performs a yearly season of choral concerts. Co-sponsors the Young Vocal Artist Competition

Historic Rapid City (Historic RC)

Dedicated to preservation of historic sites and landmarks. Current project is restoration of the McGillycuddy House.

Minnilusa Historical Ass’n (Minnilusa)

A public museum devoted to advancement of knowledge of BH pioneer living through preservation and research.

RC Ranger Band (Ranger Band)

Since 1950 Ranger Band has served as Rapid City’s marching ambassador to Hills area summer parades.

RC Arts Council (RCAC)

Administers the Dahl Arts Center. Provides community arts & cultural activities. Presents children’s arts programming, children’s theatre series, Artscamp, and the first ever *Art Inside Out*, a community friendly arts festival.

RC Concert Association (RCCA)

Presents a music series, featuring nationally-known artists.

RC Children’s Chorus (RCCC)

A nationally recognized children’s choir provides a season of music education and performance for area 3rd to 8th grade children.

RC Municipal Band (RC Municipal Band)

Presents free concerts at the Memorial Park Band Shell during June and July.

Storybook Island (SBI)

Provides free, safe fun and education for all, especially children and families.

City investment works

In 1994, the City of Rapid City designated Allied Arts Fund as administrator of City Investment dollars. Allied Arts Fund developed and adopted the criteria and guidelines for regranting and created the City Investment Committee. The City Investment Committee is composed of citizens familiar with the arts, but not serving on an arts board.

Each year the City Investment Committee reviews the grant applications and makes recommendations to the City Council for dispersal with the goal of enriching the lives of the people in our community.

All the funds directly benefit the arts in the Black Hills.



The Allied Arts Fund is a 501(c)3 non-profit organization.

City investment creates

- \$1,853,774 in revenue to Rapid City
- 1,628 culturally-enriching events to our community
- discovery of the arts to over 356,709 children
- the beauty, inspiration, and joy of the arts to over 423,195 people annually
- over 523 nonprofit arts jobs
- \$8,950 in scholarships to children, schools and low income
- \$48,570 of donated tickets for events to children, schools, & the underprivileged

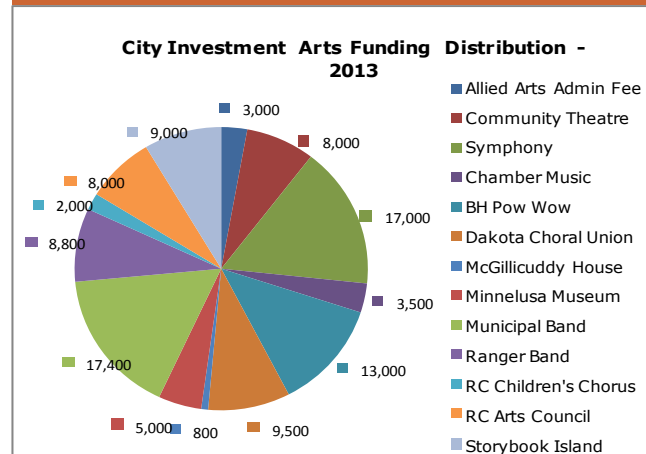


Young people who participate in arts programs are:
